**ADULT DOWN SYNDROME CLINIC**

<b>PURPOSE</b>	The goal of the Adult Down Syndrome Clinic of the Nisonger Center is to provide a comprehensive program of complete medical and baseline psychiatric evaluations, focusing on issues specific to adults with Down syndrome and their families. In addition, the program serves as a resource for health care providers who need medical information about adults with Down syndrome or help managing their medical care.
<b>PERSONS SERVED</b>	Adults with Down syndrome, ages 18 and older.
<b>REFERRALS</b>	Physician, family, and self-referrals accepted.
<b>STAFF</b>	The clinic is staffed by Elizabeth Lucas, MD, Stephanie Santoro, MD and Betsey Benson, PhD.
<b>SERVICES</b>	The OSU Adult Down Syndrome Clinic staff meets with the individual, family members, and care providers. Following the appointment, a report with recommendations is sent to the referring physician, patient, and family. The clinic meets on the 1 <sup>st</sup> and 3 <sup>rd</sup> Mondays of the month.
<b>LOCATION</b>	Appointments are scheduled at the Nisonger Center, 3 <sup>rd</sup> floor McCampbell Hall.
<b>COST</b>	Insurance is billed.
