ADULT DOWN SYNDROME CLINIC

PURPOSE	The goal of the Adult Down Syndrome Clinic of the Nisonger Center is to provide a comprehensive program of complete medical and baseline psychiatric evaluations, focusing on issues specific to adults with Down syndrome and their families. In addition, the program serves as a resource for health care providers who need medical information about adults with Down syndrome or help managing their medical care.
PERSONS SERVED	Adults with Down syndrome, ages 18 and older.
REFERRALS	Physicians, family and self-referrals accepted.
STAFF	The clinic is staffed by Elizabeth Lucas, MD, Stephanie Santoro, MD and Betsey Benson, PhD.
SERVICES	The OSU Adult Down Syndrome Clinic staff meets with the individual, family members and care providers. Following the appointment, a report with recommendations is sent to the referring physician, patient and family. The clinic meets on the 1 st and 3 rd Mondays of the month.
LOCATION	Appointments are scheduled at the Nisonger Center, 3 rd floor McCampbell Hall.
