**Where is the GREEN monkey?**

**Seeking individuals (Williams syndrome or typically developing) for an eye tracking study**



Participants with Williams syndrome (12-30 years) and typically developing participants (5-30 years) will play computer games that measure their language comprehension and how quickly they can find the location of a star on a computer screen. During these games, their eye movements will be tracked. They will also play a computer game that measures how well they ignore irrelevant information. The KBIT-2 cognitive test may also be given.

The study will take 25 -45 minutes (depending on whether or not the KBIT is given).

Participants will be reimbursed 2 tickets to the COSI science museum in Columbus, OH, or \$50. Parking at Ohio State University will be free.

The participants will also be given information about a second Williams syndrome study that takes place at COSI in Columbus, OH.
