




The 2013 Youth Risk Behavior Survey (YRBS), administered by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, found disparities for substance use among youth with and without disabilities in Ohio.

## Alcohol Use 35% 30% 277.7% 25% 20% 15% 10% No Disability Disability













## **Hallucinogenic Drugs**



Overall findings show that youth with disabilities are <u>much more likely</u> to have negative health outcomes related to substance usage than their peers without disabilities.
