ADULT DOWN SYNDROME CLINIC

PURPOSE	The goal of the Adult Down Syndrome Clinic of the OSU Division of Human Genetics and the Nisonger Center is to provide a comprehensive program of complete medical and baseline psychological evaluations, focusing on issues specific to adults with Down syndrome and their families. In addition, the program serves as a resource for health care providers who need medical information about adults with Down syndrome or help managing their medical care.
PERSONS SERVED	Adults with Down syndrome, ages 18 and older.
REFERRALS	Physician, family, and self-referrals accepted.
STAFF	The clinic is staffed by Elizabeth Lucas, M.D. and Vanessa Rodriguez, Ph.D., BCBA-D.
SERVICES	The OSU Adult Down Syndrome Clinic staff meets with the individual, family members, and care providers. Following the appointment, a report with recommendations is sent to the referring physician, patient, and family. The clinic meets on the 1 st Monday afternoon of the month.
