Answers to questions about COVID-19 vaccines

The COVID-19 vaccines are brand new. A lot of people have questions about the vaccines. Please read below for answers to common questions.



Q: What is a COVID-19 vaccine?

A: A COVID-19 vaccine is a shot to help your body not get sick from the COVID-19 virus.



Q: Are COVID-19 vaccines safe?

A: Yes. The vaccines were given to a lot of people as a test to show they are okay for people to use.

Q: The COVID-19 vaccine was made in a very short time. Was it tested enough?

A: Yes. Scientists worked as a team to make and test the COVID-19 vaccines faster. The tests showed that the vaccines are okay for people to use.




Q: Do I have to get the COVID-19 vaccine?

A: There is no law that you have to get the vaccine. But, your work or other places may say they want you to have the vaccine before you go there.



Q: Will I get the COVID-19 virus from the COVID-19 vaccine shot?

A: No. A vaccine will not make you sick with the virus. It will not make you test positive for COVID-19. If you feel bad after your shot, it will not last long.



Q: I had the COVID-19 virus. Should I get the COVID-19 vaccine?

A: Yes. The vaccine can help people who have already had COVID-19 stay healthy. It can also help their friends and family stay healthy.



Answers to questions about COVID-19 vaccines


Q: I don't think I would get very sick if I got COVID-19. Why should I get a vaccine shot?

A: You could get very sick from COVID-19. Getting the COVID-19 vaccine can help you stay healthy.



Q: If I had the flu vaccine shot, does that mean I will not get sick from COVID-19?

A: No. A flu shot only helps you <u>not</u> get sick from the flu. You need to get the COVID-19 vaccine to help you <u>not</u> get sick from COVID-19.




Q: Will there be enough COVID-19 vaccine shots for everyone to get one?

A: Yes. Everyone who wants the COVID-19 vaccine will be able to get it. Ask your health provider how and when you can get vaccine shots.




Q: Are there tracking microchips in COVID-19 vaccine shots?

A: No. COVID-19 vaccine shots are <u>only medicine</u> to help you <u>not</u> get sick from the virus.



Q: Will the COVID-19 vaccine shot give me a serious disease or disability?

A: No. The COVID-19 vaccine was tested. People did not get a disease or disability from the vaccine. Talk to your doctor if you have allergies to medicine.
