coordinating services that foster self-determination, social connections, and campus involvement. The program was established in 2016 by a LEND cohort and the Department of Social Work and Family Support Services at The Ohio State University Nisonger Center.

GOAL The goal of Ace! is to empower students with effective communication and self-advocacy skills

that promote success in college and throughout life.

PERSONS Students who have been accepted into an accredited university degree program, are enrolled in

classes, and self-identify having a diagnosis of autism or other social communication disorders.
